Understanding that people are precious to God.*

Review

- Human beings are Precious to God.
- Human beings are key to fulfilling God's Vision Plan of Colonization.
- If People are Precious to God, what should be my Response?

Today's Focus:

Revelation on Preciousness of Souls, Pt.7

If People are Precious to God, I Must Relate Well to Non-Believers.

I mean people who have not surrendered to Christ; we must relate to them in the right way. Turn with me to **Colossians 4:5-6**

5 Be wise in the way you act toward those who are not believers, making good use of every opportunity you have. 6 Your speech should always be

pleasant and interesting, and you should know how to give the right answer to everyone. (Colossians 4:5-6, Good News Bible)

- Colossians 4:5-6 teaches us we can relate well to non-believers by our behavior and by our speech.

How do I relate to people who are non-believers?

1. I must be wise in the way I act towards non-believers.

- a. My actions should be based on God's view of things – Isaiah 55:9; Proverbs 14:12

God's way is that you bless those who curse you.....
God's way is that he goes after the sinner until He gets him or her.

- b. I accept people the way they are. Straight, Gay, Asian, Caucasian, Adulterers, etc.
- c. Avoid anything that puts your Christian testimony in doubt – 2 Corinthians 3:2

2. I make the most of every opportunity when I am among non-believers – Colossians 4:5

5 Be wise in the way you act toward those who are not believers, making good use of every opportunity you have.

- Be aware and sensitive to the needs of unbelievers
- Offer some help when you sense the need

3. I speak words that are suitable and needful – Colossians 4:6

Your speech should always be pleasant and interesting, and you should know how to give the right answer to everyone. (Colossians 4:6, Good News Bible)

Ephesians 4:29

Let no foul or polluting language, nor evil word nor unwholesome or worthless talk [ever] come out of your mouth, but only such [speech] as is good and beneficial to the spiritual progress of others, as is fitting to the need and the occasion, that it may be a blessing and give grace (God's favor) to those who hear it. (Ephesians 4:29, Amplified Bible, Classic Edition)

4. I must speak to preserve truth – Colossians 4:6

Your speech should always be pleasant and interesting, and you should know how to give the right answer to everyone. (Colossians 4:6, Good News Bible)
