## Imposition of Ashes


Ashes have been a symbol of contrition since biblical times:
"I repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:6b).
They are also vivid reminders of mortality:
"For dust you are and to dust you shall return (Genesis 3:19).

Therefore the imposition of ashes is a fitting beginning for the season of Lent.

Ashes powerfully imagine our contrition and mortality,
but they also speak the Gospel – applied to the forehead in the shape of the cross,
where sin and death were conquered and we are cleansed of our sin.

Those who wish to receive ashes imposed on the forehead are invited to come forward down the center aisle to the altar.
